Last week our Sports Captains were looking for children showing 'enthusiasm' during PE. This week they looked for 'Resilience' which was really put to the test in the snowy conditions!






PTA support for Mathletics

Central Trust Team Newsletter – February 2018

Safer Internet Day

The first Tuesday of February saw Safer Internet Day held in schools across the Trust. This year's theme was 'Create, Connect and Share Respect: A better internet starts with you', which reflects our commitment to empowering young people at the same time that we ensure the highest safeguarding standards. The initiative,



headed by the UK Safer Internet Centre (a coalition of charities; Childnet, the South West Grid for Learning and the Internet Watch Foundation), targets schools, parents and carers – as well as industry and government – to harness the positive effects of the internet whilst reducing its risks.

Anne Longfield, Children's Commissioner for England, appreciates the importance of such an initiative:

"The internet and social media are a permanent part of modern

childhood and they offer huge opportunities to learn and connect. Safer Internet Day brings schools, parents, teachers and industry together to make sure children have the power, information and resilience they need to make safe and informed choices online."

We believe that it's crucial to nurture an interest in ideas themselves, and are therefore committed to providing the resources needed to pursue such discovery both safely and effectively.

EYFS Moderation Day

We were pleased to be able to bring together Early Years Foundation Stage leaders from across Bellevue

Place Education Trust and the independent Bellevue Schools group for two moderation day sessions, covering both the North and South of the country. Leaders assessed the level of judging pupils' work in reception, looking at how we evaluate the impact of the ways we teach and support pupils through the academic year and beyond. We are aiming to establish School Evaluation Forms (SEF), where early years is a key area of focus and recognised as a crucial aspect of what we do. Moderation days are central to our values of collaboration and commitment. By working together, we ensure best practice across the Trust and for the benefit of all pupils.



BCS Garden Opening

Braywick Court School was delighted to have a very special visitor open its new Nature Garden on the temporary site at West Dean this January (26). Prime Minister and constituency MP, Theresa May, quizzed pupils about her boss the Queen, before taking a tour of the garden's numerous creative features. Highlights include a 'bug hotel' and 'hedgehog corner'! The project has been named 'Hasna's Garden', to commemorate the sister of current pupils Lugmaan and Hana. Hasna tragically passed away when she was less than a day old. Working through a wet and windy weekend, the PTA have demonstrated the robust sense of community that characterises all of our schools. Looking forwards, the school's green ethos will have further opportunities to shine as it moves to a permanent home on Hibbert Road, in close proximity to the Braywick Nature Reserve.





Consultation on the proposed changes to the BPET Local Governance structure

BPET was created in 2012 and, after opening our first school in 2013, is now operational on seven sites. One school has already been recognised as outstanding, and two being judged as Good by Ofsted. The success of BPET so far has been achieved thanks to the efforts of all staff, trustees and other supporters. As you know, we are committed to continuous improvement efforts as part of our culture, and we are consulting on the proposed changes in Local Governance arrangements, with details set out below.

The BPET Board has agreed to consult about proposed changes to Local Governance Arrangements in its schools which are designed to

Reduce the duplication of roles and responsibilities between the Board, Local Governance volunteers and the central executive team

Implement what we have learnt from the experience of the first 6 years of operating the Trust Clarify the role and purpose of parental and other stakeholder engagement at each school Make better use of staff, trustee and local volunteers in the interests of the children's education

The Trust is bringing forward proposals to replace the Local Governing Bodies with Local Advisory Boards in an effort to tackle these criticisms without diluting the commitment to working with each school community to deliver schools that are sensitive and responsive to local views and opinions.

Background

The National Governance Association conducted an external review of the governance structure across the Trust in 2016/17, with a workshop in September 2016 involving Trustees, Chairs and Headteachers.

The external review report recommended "work with staff and LGB members to reach a new settlement for school-level governance within BPET". This report sets out the detail of a move to Local Advisory Boards, replacing Local Governing Bodies. The main purposes of the new Local Advisory Boards will be:

to maintain an overview of the educational attainment and achievement of the school to advise on the School Development Plan proposals to assist the school in meeting the needs of the local community it serves.

Timetable

The consultation is planned to run from 28 February 2018 to 6 April 2018, with a final decision in April 2018. If agreed, the changeover is planned during the summer to allow the new Local Advisory Boards to be up and running from the start of the Autumn Term 2018.
