Changes to school governance

Following a recent consultation with the National Governors Association, BPET, the operating trust for Deer Park School, has decided to make a change to the governing structure for their schools. The Local Governing Board has been replaced by a Local Advisory Board (LAB)!

The day to day operation of the school remains the same, there will be no obvious difference for the pupils, parents and staff. The change comes in adopting trust developed policies and management systems covering issues such as finance, safeguarding and health and safety. These previously were developed by each individual school under BPET's management. The LAB will focus more on the education performance of the school and delivery of the School Development Plan.

James Boyle (father of Eoin in Muntjac and Conor in Fawn classes) has been appointed chair of the LAB and chaired the first meeting with the previous governors who have accepted positions on the LAB. These are Frances Bracegirdle, Nick Hodgess and Chris Gallant (father of Rhaea in Muntjac class). James and Alison will be working together to assess the membership needs to ensure that the board is fully manned by the next meeting in January.

The LAB meets four times per school year to understand performance and key issues within the school. There is also a requirement for each member to visit the school to assess progress against key focus areas on the School Development Plan.


