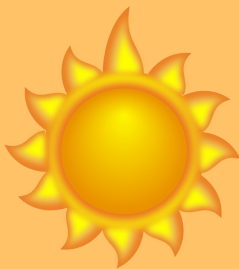

Hot and Sunny Weather

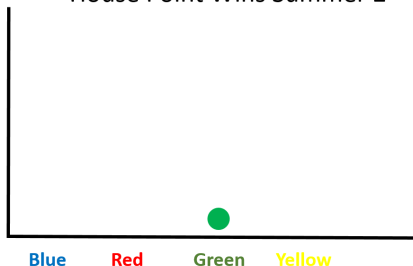
