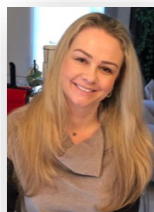

Marsh Class enjoyed some Japanese art. They made carp kites which

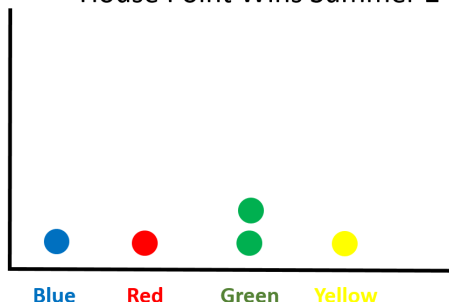
Japanese children traditionally do on children's day. They also painted cherry blossom trees with cotton buds, made fans and did some origami.

Well done to all our golden awardees!

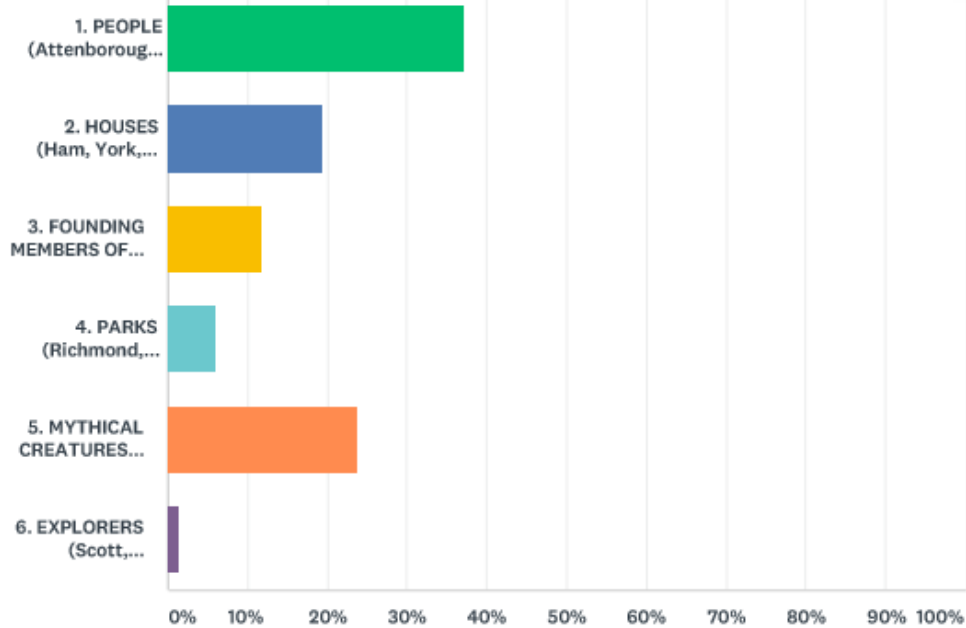

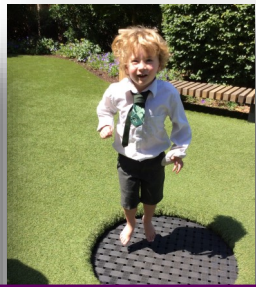


After learning about the initiative 'Waste Free Wednesdays', we creatively recycled old packaging!
