#### Literacy

Children to recall main events from a story and to write their name accurately.

Children to use their phonic knowledge to aid them in segmenting and blending words.

**School Activities:** Match name to photo, recognise name, cut name and reassemble, tracing lines, joining in with stories, sequence main parts as a group, join in with rhymes and repeated refrains, rhyming bag, rhyming lotto, label body parts, alliteration games, listening games, identifying sounds eg making the sounds of different farm animals.

**Home learning**: Choose your favourite story and create a zig-zag book, sequence the main events from 'Elmer', go to your local library, share a wide range bedtime stories, food shopping list, name writing/mark making, rhyming games.

#### **Physical Development**

Children to travel around with confidence and skill, negotiating space and avoiding obstacles. Children to use tools effectively and safely.

**School Activities**: Travelling in different ways e.g. crawling, balancing, action songs and rhymes (head, shoulders knees and toes, Simon says); moving to the music, healthy eating, washing hands routine, pencil grip, name writing, play dough disco getting dressed and undressed (including putting on ties).

**Home learning:** Create a healthy dinner together, practise dressing and undressing, create a healthy diary (parent can scribe), use local parks for developing climbing, catching, kicking skills, help with tidying up the garden- use rakes, brushes and shovels.

### **Expressive Arts and Design**

Children to create and use props in their play and to choose particular colours for a purpose.

School Activities: Self-portraits, painting portraits of friends, collage faces, play dough faces, finger/hand painting, printing with objects to make a person, drawing around children using chalk, listening to music and how it makes us feel, moving our bodies to the beat, singing different songs and nursery rhymes, making up own songs, using body as an instrument.

**Home learning:** act out a scene from their favourite story, create a musical accompaniment to different parts of 'Funny Bones' and use junk modelling to create their home.

# **Communication and Language**

Children to be able to retell past events, in the correct order, using complex sentences.

**School Activities:** Talk about feelings, Simon says, instructional games e.g. beans games, show and tell – linked to the topic, sharing philosophy bear, naming body parts.

**Home learning:** listen carefully to stories and join in with common phrases and words, ask questions about the story, play Chinese whispers and follow cooking instructions.

# Understanding of the World

Children to be able to talk about special events that are personal to them.

School Activities: Discuss our journey to school, blind tasting, comparing likes and dislikes (taste, smell), feely bag, texture collage, making rubbings using different materials, making texture comparisons, using pictures or group members to recognise similarities and differences; use of magnifying glasses, colour paddles, mirrors, sound walks, guess the instrument.

**Home learning:** visit your local park/forest and take pictures of natural objects and discuss, ICT- type your name-edit it using different colours, size and fonts, create a family poster and research about all the different types of people/cultures in the world.

## Personal Social and Emotional Development

Children to confidently speak in front of small and larger groups of children. Children to be able to play in a group co-operatively.

**School Activities:** Circle times, show and tell, role play area, taking turns games, Philosophy, illustrating different types of feelings, looking after babies (bathing, dressing feeding).

**Home learning:** discuss feelings- how did you feel on your first day at school? Share household chores e.g. cleaning, what is your favourite thing about yourself?

#### **Mathematics**

Children to be able to count accurately using one to one correspondence and to understand that anything can be count (including claps, jumps etc.)

**School Activities:** Counting fingers and toes, number rhymes, looking at pairs (arms, legs, feet, socks, gloves, shoes), comparing sizes, ordering themselves by height, creating shape patterns, number and shape puzzles, 2D shape robots, creating a whole class number line.

Home learning: recognise door numbers (extend to looking at odd/even), count actions- jump, skip, hop, clap, count steps, 2D/3D shape hunt walk- identify the types of shapes on houses, sort toys or animals by colour, size, shape and weight. Go shopping- use coins (1ps) to buy food etc.




