Please remember that if you have any concerns or questions about anything that my door is always open.



Curriculum Intent Statement (Why we teach what we teach)

Deer Park School is a small, diverse community on the outskirts of London. Our curriculum is built from an understanding of this context with the consensus of the school's staff, the school community and the pupils but will always evolve to reflect our school community as we grow.

Our curriculum is everything that happens to every single pupil in school from Breakfast Club through to Evening Owls and everything in between including trips and visitors. This curriculum balances the development of independence and resilience with the need for support and nurturing. Through the breadth and depth of our curriculum we inspire curiosity and enthusiasm to prepare the pupils for a life-long love of learning that comes from the child's own happiness and desire to learn. At each and every stage we encourage our pupils to question what they know and what they want to know.

Our pupils become reflective and responsible learners through an understanding of the how our world is made and how our world works. Also, they learn through the significance of events and people and how these have shaped our present world and how we can learn to protect our community and world in the future going forward. In addition, our ambitious curriculum develops pupils' deep understanding of their own physical well-being through areas of the curriculum that develop the physical self: such are PE, PHSE and DT. Our pupils learn to develop mental well-being through creative subjects that give pleasure and allow appreciation such Art and Music. Nurturing our children through PSHE and RSE to ensure they understand themselves and others and how to sustain mental wellbeing. Our curriculum immerses our pupils in their diverse school community through RE and PSHE and allows them to thoughtfully, compare and contrast this with very different communities locally and around the world in order to develop tolerance and understanding. Therefore, our pupils will achieve academically, economically and socially.

New Years Resolutions

We thought about starting a new year and discussed that this was often a time when people thought about what they would like to do better. I asked the children if they had made any resolutions. Some of the replies were: keep my room tidy, help my mum unload the dishwasher and do what I am asked to do the first time I am asked. Inclusivity at Deer Park School

Deer Park School prides itself on its inclusive ethos. **Every** child regardless of culture, background, social and emotional needs or educational needs is in included in all areas of our curriculum. Here is the quote from Ofsted 2018

"The most able pupils and those who have special educational needs (SEN) and/or disabilities make excellent progress from their starting points. Teachers provide work which is well matched to pupils' level of ability. They provide pupils with additional support or challenge where needed. "

Each teacher plans their units of work and lessons in order that **every** child can access the learning and be challenged by the learning. This is done by scaffolding learning, differentiating questions asked, providing visual support, Teaching Assistant and teacher support and mixed ability groups. For example, for a lesson on sentences, the majority of the class will be able to access the task from the teacher's input at the start. The teacher will provide sentence starters for a child who needs that support. In addition, all pupils will be offered the challenge of using complex sentences. All teachers have a thorough understanding of the children in their class and adapt their planning and expectations accordingly.

In addition, 1:1 support and smaller group work takes place throughout the day, across the school. Some are specific and run for a period of 6 weeks and others take place straight after the lessons to consolidate learning or extend children's learning.

See below for a selection of types of work that children take part in across the school either in groups or 1:1.






Our wonderful teaching assistants!
