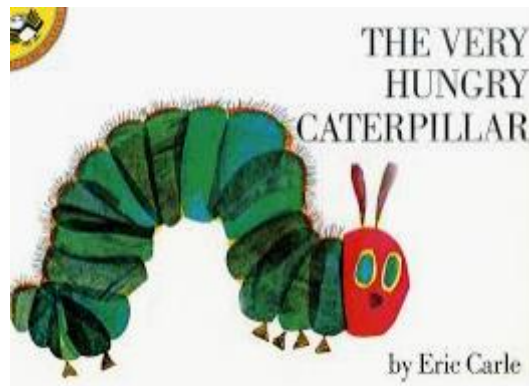


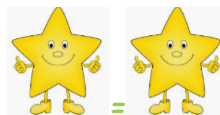
Friday 14th February
