This week in Year 4 have been learning about statistics, written book reviews, learnt about the layers of the rainforest, researched the Brazilian football team and created paintings inspired by street art.

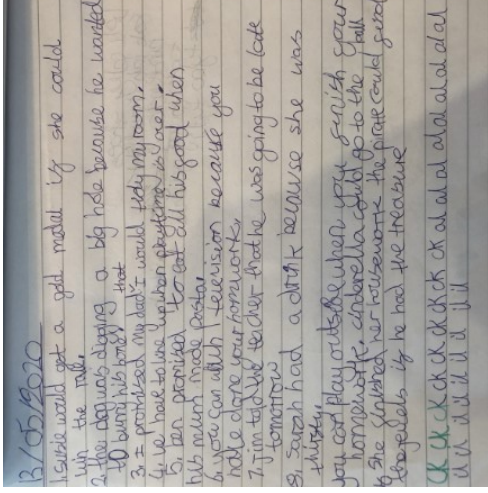

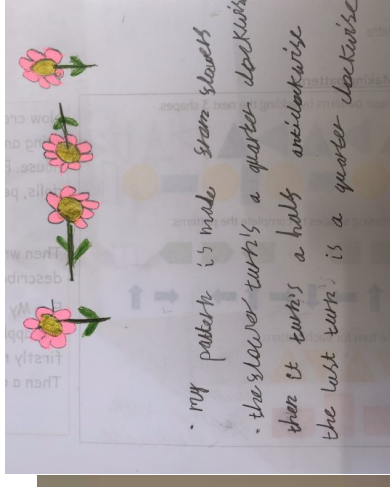

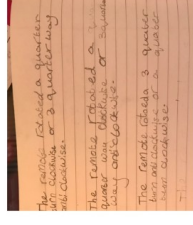

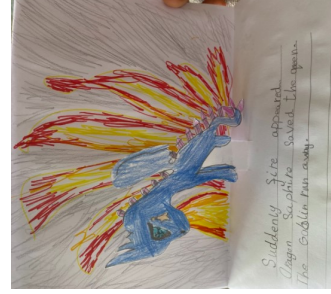

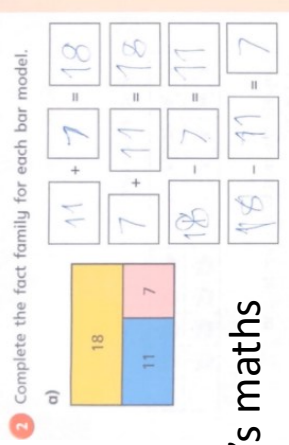
