At this advent of the new academic year, I'd like to put <u>reading</u> back in the forefront of all our minds. Not simply reading, either, but the discussion and sharing of new stories - the finding of joy in a new world or idea. Reading, and engagement with it from a young age, is linked to life expectancy, happiness, income levels, ment all health and self-motivation; it is an unbelievably powerful tool for the development of the young mind. Not to mention, of course, that it's just plain fun. There are several things we can do to help our children take advantage of this. Firstly, and most obviously; read every day. Every child should read for at least 20 minutes a day, either with an adult or by themselves. It is worth remembering, however, that when in a rush a quick story is better than no reading at all. Secondly, talking with the children about reading! Discuss the books you love, discuss the books you don't love — explain what makes a book magic for you, or what makes it tedious — recommend new books and re-read your favourites, ask questions, demand longer answers, challenge ideas and preconceptions. Thirdly, of course; we ourselves should read, as parents and families. As in all things, this role-modelling carries a lasting and powerful message.


